Four doctors making a global impact on the treatment of bladder exstrophy receive recognition

St. Petersburg, FL, March 16, 2018 — Association for the Bladder Exstrophy Community (A-BE-C), a global nonprofit organization providing education and support to bladder exstrophy patients and their families, today announced that it is establishing and presenting the Richard W. Grady Humanitarian Award to recognize work that elevates the standards of care for children born with the rare medical condition of bladder exstrophy.

All four recipients of the inaugural award are involved in bladder exstrophy care in India, where the unmet need for treatment that is greater than anyplace else in the world.

The award is named for the late Dr. Richard W. Grady of Seattle, an internationally known expert and humanitarian in the field of bladder exstrophy. Award recipients are identified as individuals who exemplify the highest value of leadership, excellence in clinical care and research, innovation, teaching, volunteerism, advocacy, and dedication to improve the health of those living with bladder exstrophy around the world.

Drs. Joshi and Ramji were presented their awards at a ceremony on January 20, 2018 in Ahmedabad, India. On January 29, 2018, Drs. Desai and Desai received their award in Nadidad, India.
